Professor Jason Arday Professor of Sociology of Education University of Cambridge

Jason Arday is Professor of Sociology of Education at the University of Cambridge, Faculty of Education, and a Professorial Fellow at Jesus College, Cambridge. He was formerly a Guest Editor on BBC Radio 4's Today Programme and listed fourth on the prestigious Shaw Trust Disability Power 100 in 2023.

Professor Arday has previously held the position of Professor of Sociology of Education at the University of Glasgow, School of Education; Associate Professor in Sociology at Durham University in the Department of Sociology; and Deputy Executive Dean for People and Culture in the Faculty of Social Science and Health. He is a Visiting Professor at The Ohio State University in the Office of Diversity and Inclusion, University of Glasgow in the School of Education, and an Honorary Professor at Durham University in the Department of Sociology.

He is a Patron of the Adult Literacy Trust (ALT) and Get Further. He is also a Trustee of the British Sociological Association (BSA). Jason sits on the NHS Race and Health Observatory Academic Reference Group and the ITV Cultural Advisory Council.



Emily Norman Head of Curriculum and Inclusion for the National Society for Education Church of England

Emily Norman is the Head of Curriculum and Inclusion for the National Society for Education (Church of England Education Office). Her role includes delivering on the Church of England's <u>From Lament to Action</u> report, specifically in regards to racial justice in the Education sector. This work includes the 'Leaders Like Us' programme for aspiring UKME/GMH school leaders.

Emily has previously overseen the Church of England Education Office's networks for school leaders and partnerships with dioceses, MATs and schools all over the country. Emily worked with colleagues from overseas to initiate the Church of England's International Diversity Networks, working with school and systems leaders in the USA, Canada, India and Australia, as well as in the UK, to discuss ways of implementing EDIJ strategies in schools.

She has been a headteacher in central London, working in schools where over 70 different languages were spoken, a SIAMS inspector, RE consultant and has studied Theology and Leadership at postgraduate level.
